

The consent of the Governing Body must be obtained through the Director before any other paid work of a continuous nature is undertaken.
4. Lecturers who desire to be absent from their duties at the School must make written application for leave for a definite period to the Director through the Head of their Department. Leave of absence for a period exceeding two months requires the sanction of the Governing Body.

The Finance and General Purposes Committee recently considered the conditions under which leave should be granted to members of staff who receive invitations for temporary employment at universities in the United States and Canada. It has become a common practice for these universities to approach individuals direct with an offer of an inclusive sum for a fixed period. This sum often appears to be assessed only in relation to salary, without special account of fares, superannuation, family allowances or other emoluments. When such questions are raised lecturers are frequently told that the sum originally quoted represents the total money available.

For this and other reasons the Finance and General Purposes Committee has decided that questions of leave and secondment and the financial conditions under which it should be granted must be settled between the Director and the university concerned, and not negotiated directly by a member of the staff. This letter is, therefore, to ask you, in the event of your receiving such an invitation, to indicate in reply whether you would be willing to accept it in principle, and at the same time to request that application should be made to the Director who will then indicate whether leave can be granted, and if so, the financial conditions attached to it. tended that universities who wish to secure the temporary use of members of the School staff should meet the total cost involved, including payment to the lecturer of an adequate salary.

Dear Mr. Gökyay,

We are very pleased to be able to report that the above Appeal has now made sufficient progress to ensure that our aim of building the first stage of the library will be achieved.

Her Majesty The Queen, the Patron of the School, has headed the list of personal subscribers and many business concerns, widely representative of industry and commerce, have given their support; the total sum promised so far is close on £150,000. Attached for your information is a list of those who have contributed.

In addition, the Rockefeller Foundation promised us a grant provided that the balance of the sum required could be raised from other sources.

The Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation has also promised a grant for the provision of a Seminar Room devoted to the study of Art and Archaeology, provided the building of the Library goes ahead.

We have had donations from the Governments of Hong Kong, North Borneo, Tanganyika, Swaziland, Uganda and Northern Rhodesia and we are hopeful of further contributions from other Governments.

Altogether the total sum contributed to date is a little more than £255,000 and the Court of the University of London, taking into account this generous support, has agreed to meet any shortfall which remains between the results of the Appeal and the target figure of £300,000. Thus the conditions of both the Rockefeller Foundation and the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation have been met.

Plans of the Library are now being developed by Mr. Denys Lasdun, M.B.E., F.R.I.B.A., who has been the Architect for a number of University and similar buildings. The preparations to clear the site, which adjoins the School, will entail some rehousing of other activities. These matters are in the hands of the University of London.

Subscribers to the Appeal may rest assured that in helping to meet this need they have contributed materially to the development in this country of a considerable range of studies essential to the better understanding of the peoples of Asia and Africa, and also to the provision of facilities that will prove of lasting benefit to Asian and African scholars pursuing post-graduate work in London. The School is a centre of learning that may claim in a very real sense to be supra-national and believes that it has a valuable part to play in the advancement of many people, irrespective of their colour or creed. Your support of this work is greatly appreciated, and we shall report progress when the construction stage is reached.

In conclusion, we hope that you will not fail to consult the School in all matters that lie within its scope as a University institution concerned solely with the languages, cultures, history, law and economics of Asian and African countries.

(After that correct beginning I am going to write in English; I'm afraid I am too lazy to write in Turkish! It isn't as easy for me as it once was.)

I am putting together a festschrift for C.S.Mundy, my old teacher. This letter is to ask if you would care to

contribute a paper to it.

There will probably be 16-20 papers in the volume, each a maximum of 4000 words. The whole will be offered to SOAS Publications Committee for consideration as a SOAS publication. It would be good if I could have the papers by the end of August 1989 at the very latest. That date ought to make it possible to present the typescript to the committee in time for its November 1989 meeting. Further delay is to be avoided, if at all possible, because (i) Mr Mundy is now 82 (he has just had a birthday), (ii) I shall be retiring in September 1989 and moving to the north of England from which it will be difficult to chivvy the people at SOAS.

Most contributors will be writing on topics related to Mr Mundy's main fields of interest, I should imagine, i.e. Old Ottoman and the tale. As you know he had a particular interest in the Odyssey and the tales therein which also occur in Dede Korkut and are current still in Anatolia. (ii) The Governing Body also reserves the power to terminate the appointment at any time if in its opinion the Lecturer is guilty of misconduct, and at six months' notice in cases where, in the opinion of the Governing Body, the Lecturer is failing to fulfil his duties in a proper and adequate manner. In all such cases the Lecturer shall be entitled to be heard by a committee including the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Governing Body, the Director, the Head of his Department, and two other members appointed by the Academic Board.
(iii) The appointment may, at the discretion of the Governing Body, be renewed for further periods of a year at a time to a total not exceeding five years' service in all.
3. Lecturers are not precluded from accepting such paid academic duties as Examinerships or the delivery of occasional lectures, though they must obtain the permission of the Director, through the Head of their Department, before accepting any such engagements outside the School. They must apply in writing and receive the consent of the Director before making engagements to undertake teaching outside the School. The consent of the Governing Body must be obtained through the

4. Lecturers who desire to be absent from their duties at the School must make written application for leave for a definite period to the Director through the Head of their Department. Leave of absence for a period exceeding two months requires the sanction of the Governing Body.

Director before any other paid work of a continuous nature is undertaken.

- 5. Lecturers are required to comply with the regulations regarding sick leave. These regulations, which apply during vacations as well as during terms, are incorporated in the Standing Orders of the Governing Body, as set out in the Calendar of the School.
- 6. Resignations from Lectureships may only take effect at the end of an academic session, unless for a reason approved by the Governing Body. Notice of resignation must be given in writing on or before the preceding 30th April.
 - 7. Lecturers are required to reside within thirty miles of the School buildings.
