Dear Dr. Duggan,

I have always been glad that I met you that morning at the Western Reserve University, as I value the opportunity of having you for a friend.

Dr. Riza Tewfik, a former member of our faculty, informs me that he is hoping to lecture for you in America. I do not know whether he has received a definite invitation from you, but in any case I would like to give you the following information in regard to him:

Riza Tewfik Bey, is a philosopher and poet. He signed the Treaty of Sevres on behalf of Turkey and is now under sentence of death from the Nationalist government. He has held at different times office of Minister of Public Instruction, Minister of Posts, and President of the Council of State. He was also for many years professor of Philosophy in the Imperial Ottoman University and was the first to insist on the free attendance of women in the general classes of the University. He lost his position there on account of his free speaking. He still holds the position of Senator, which is held for life. At the time when he was sent to sign the Treaty of Sevres he held the position of President of the Council of State. Dr. Riza Tewfik is a real philosopher and a real poet.

You remember, perhaps, that you thought we might succeed in obtaining a Carnegie Library of American Literature. I hope very much indeed that that opportunity may be realized for us.

We are opening the College under circumstances of great difficulty. Our enrollment was arrested by the fear which has reigned everywhere since the fall of Smyrna. We are hoping, however, that peace may soon be established and our enrollment begin again and that we may come up to our full numbers.

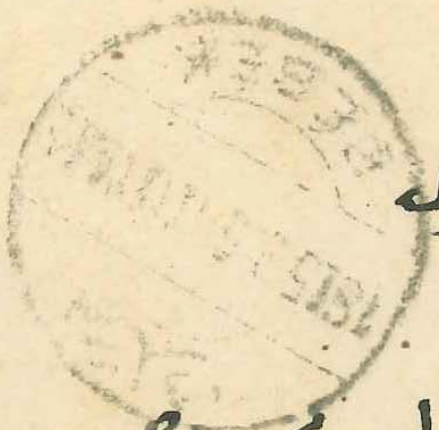
