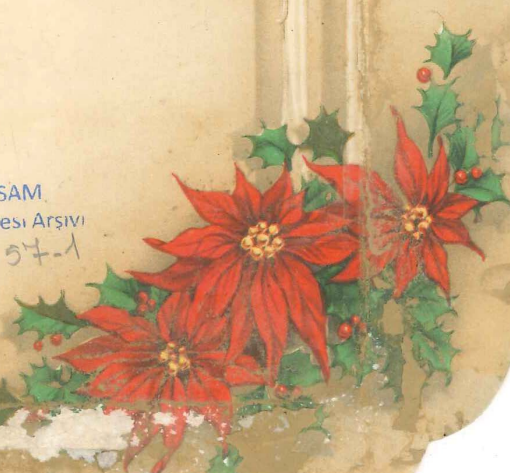

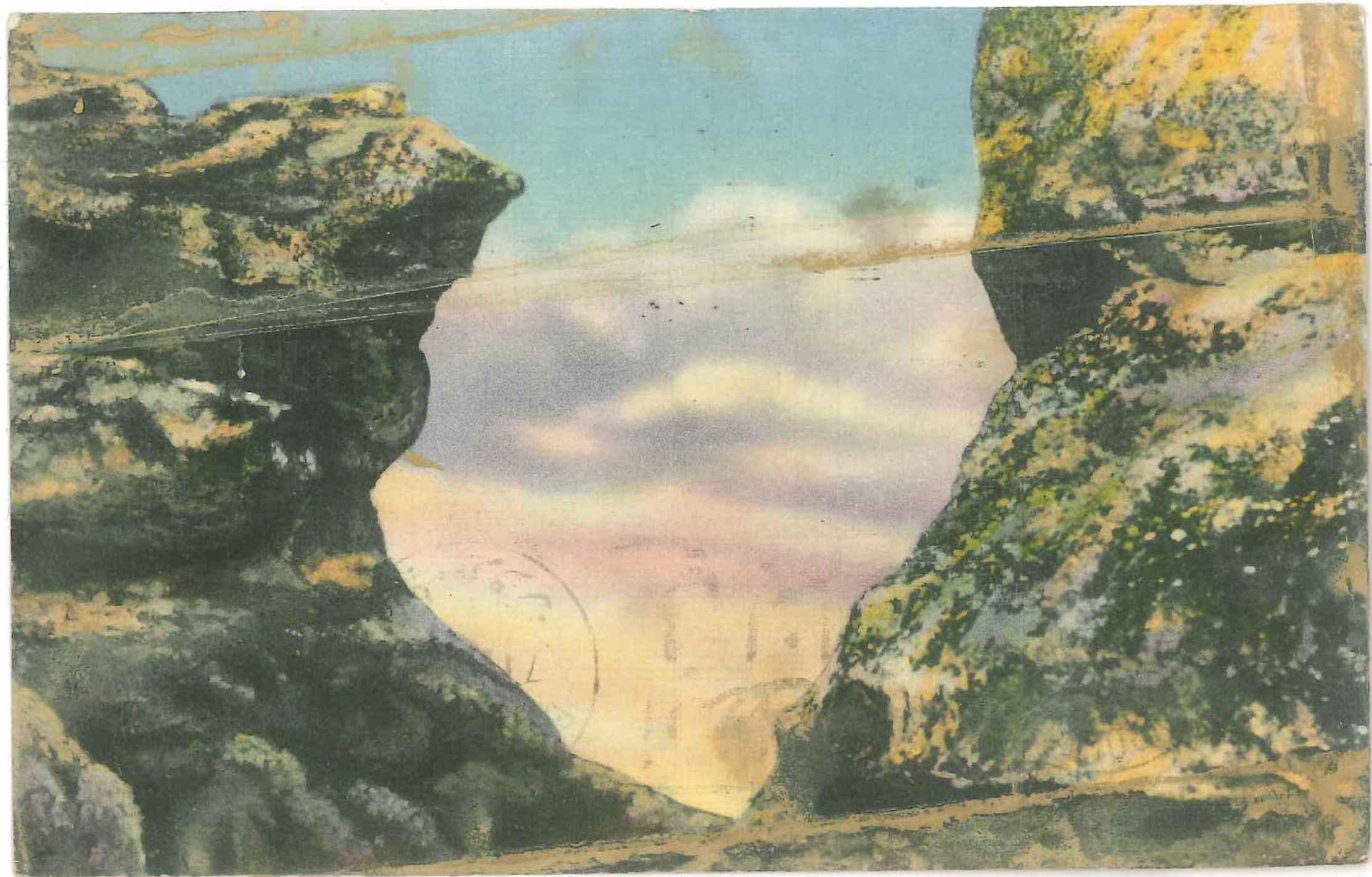

My dear Dr. Riza Tewfik:

It has been brought to my notice that you sometimes, or generally, use the name Constantinople College in articles written for the newspapers. In this way the College is in the mind of the public connected with the article unjustly, of course, but nevertheless the idea gets abroad that you write for the College, which, of course, is not the case. I am sure that you will agree with me that the College ought, so far as possible, to conduct its work without public criticism and to secure this it should not be connected with articles that invite criticism. I know your esteem for all connected with the College is so great that you will not in any way bring the name of the College in this way into the papers. Will it not be better to omit the name of the College altogether from your articles?

The friends of the College and, indeed, all of us value your work and especially the splendid stand you have taken for right and for the best things for your people and your Nation and I hope what I have written will be taken in the spirit in which it is written, namely, not one of faultfinding, but as a suggestion as to a point which probably has been overlooked but which relates to the good of the institution which we all value and prize.

My dear old friend

It was a real pleasure to get yours of the 31st August. I had just returned to our apartment in the city when it came. We always go to an Inn on the mountains to escape the heat of July & August. The remainder of the year we find it comfortable in the city. There are two mountains. (Lookout and Signal) very near to Chattanooga. These are 1500. feet above the city. There the air is pure, the winds have free play, the trees and grass are green, for rain is abundant up there, and the air is cool while in the city below the air may be stifling. The situation resembles that of Beirut with its mountain nearby. The ride (by auto) from the city to the top of either mountain is only about 1/2 an hour. Signal mountain gets its name from the signal station the troops maintained on ~~it~~ during the war. Lookout has a great many monuments, and the like from the days of the civil war. (The war between the States). The views from both mountains over the surrounding country and the great city at the foot are wide and fine. Eight states can be seen from Signal Mt with the ^{beautiful} the.

Blue Ridge, Cumberland ranges & Systems in the distance
Flowing at foot of both Lookout & Signal is the great
Tennessee River whose valley includes a large part
of ~~the~~ ^{three} States. The government is undertaking a large
work in the Valley of the Tennessee River, in the line
of flood control, hydro Electric Power, reforestation
etc. Several large dams have been built on the
Tennessee River & its tributaries to hold and to use for
power. The large ~~amount~~ ^{amount} of water that flows in the River
The Tennessee River is one of the large tributaries of
of the great Mississippi which drains $\frac{1}{10}$ of the entire
~~area~~ area of the United States - There is a cable rail
way up Lookout Mountain and both mountains are
provided with well graded & cement roads to the
top. On the top of both mountains is a large
town or city with regular auto bus lines to Chattanooga
and hotels of all grades. The Americans use the auto-
mobile a great deal and one sees cars from every part
of country showing that people are taking a holiday and
enjoying life. The roads ~~are~~ ^{are} well graded & metalled every where.
My sister (Mrs Humphill) & I keep our home at the
address at the head of this sheet. My sister's oldest son Lewis
now lives a short distance away. Her other son is in
Omaha 2-3 days by auto from here - We see him every year.
My son is teaching near St Louis 2 days away. His wife
is the head of a department in the Iowa State College
a University (4000 students) - Their son my grand son enters
college this year. My son & wife are together in vacations
but teach in different schools - for the laws do no allow
a husband & wife to teach in the same school - My son

You remember for he was a student in Robert College
and got his A.B. degree there. He got his B.Sc. at an
University in this country as also his M.Sc. - His
wife, my daughter-in-law, who taught for a time
in the Girls College has just taken her Ph.D. degree

We have just heard that Dr. Huntington cannot go
back to Robert College this year as he had hoped
to do. but is sent by his physicians for further
treatment to Warm Springs Georgia - not far from
Chattanooga - This is the place where the President
goes now then - We hear often from Miss Dodd
and now then from Dr. Patrick - Mr. Strizer who was
U.S. Consul in Algiers lives in Washington. His wife
died there shortly after he was retired from service
He has married again - his ^{present} wife is a fine lady - whom
we know - Mr. Strizer you will remember is my nephew
Admiral Bristol (now retired) lives in Washington we
often hear from him. He remembers his old friends
Consul Praxidal is in the mountains of North Carolina
We understand that he has been quite ill. I have not
heard from him for some time. -

We are greatly interested in the war in the
Far East between Japan & China both countries are
our friends - Japan has developed her army and
navy while China has not done either. and is
divided into factions at home. Our sympathies
are with China who is losing her territory to the
strong power of Japan. Japan is acting like a brigand
or pickpocket who says "what is yours is mine if I can get it" -

You ask for word about myself - I met you last in Jerusalem in 1927. Was it not - I returned to America in 1928. with my work finished. I went to California thinking I would stay there the rest of my days. but after three years Mrs Hemphill, son who lives in Chattanooga asked us to come here. ~~It is~~ This is a good place to live, climate is good, people are kind and hospitable. we are getting old and it seemed to us wise to get near to those of our own family before we got too old to move so we came to this place where we now live for three years - We are so near to all the members of our families that we see them frequently and as I said above one of my aunts son is nearby on our street 10 minutes walk from us - We have been well since we came to America but that was obliged to go to a hospital for a major operation while I was in California. They did not go very well and I was about six months in the hospital. I have now made good recovery and am much better than before the operation. I am 86 years old and my sister is 91. We are active for people of our age. We have a (colored) maid who comes in every morning to help my sister get breakfast and do the work about the house - She stays & gets our midday meal - We realize of course that this cannot last long. soon all will be over and we shall be among those who are not out here any more. I thank God for my life. It has been a happy one ^{and} for the many kind & valued friends that I have had. I look into the great future with eager anticipation.
