To His Excellency. Rıza Tevfik Bey.  
Dear Sir.

Though I had not the  
honour of being introduced to you  
personally, you may perhaps remember  
meeting my father, Mr. Herbert  
Bentley during your visit to Exeter  
last summer. I am venturing upon  
the strength of your sympathy with  
the English and the Jewish Peoples  
to address to you a somewhat bold  
request. I am one of the editors  
of an English review dealing with  
Jewish Questions, of which the first  
number has just appeared. Its  
you will see from the copy which  
I am sending you we are anxious  
to give English people a true idea of  
the conditions & problems of the Jews  
in other countries. At the present

movement when the eyes of the world are turned towards the East, and the question of greatest interest to the Jewish people is the possibility of settlement within the Ottoman Empire, we are anxious to have an authoritative account of the position and prospects of the Jews in the Turkish provinces. I know well that you must have numerous calls upon your time, but if you would send us a short paper on this subject, you would not only lay us under a deep obligation of gratitude, but would I am convinced do a great service

to the Jewish cause, and have a valuable influence upon English opinion. Of course we do not want you to deal with any political question, but to describe present conditions & if you will, to suggest the steps that could be taken to ameliorate them.

I need hardly say that we should be pleased to receive an article in French, & we would submit the English translation to you before publishing it.

Together with the copy of the Review, I send you a reprint of an article which I wrote 10 months ago upon which was then the new Turkish Constitution. It may amuse you as the
