It has been quite some time since I sent you a post card but as you can see I am still travelling and wandering. Of course my present travels are past of my job, and yet they give me a chance to visit the orient with calls at Yokohama, Formosa, Hong Kong and Manila.

I have been buying many art objects and examples of folk art in all the places I visit and once in a while pick up some interesting erotic pieces. I am currently searching for tokens that were given to the Chinese soldiers and were used in finding their pleasure in government run houses.

This brings me to a subject that has been in my mind since my visit with you when Marianne and I were visiting Istanbul. I am talking about the oil lamps with carvings along the edges.

On May 1st our sister ship, the S.S. President Wilson will be in Istanbul on an unusual trip to the Black Sea and the Mediterranean. It would be an excellent opportunity to send some back to me. I am fully aware that it is rather short notice but I have just left San Francisco on my way to Japan after almost getting a job on the Wilson myself.

If at all possible could you pick up several examples for me and send them to me in care of Mr. Nyberg who is the printer on board the vessel. The address in Istanbul is S.S.
